Visit To Sri Kshetra Kurubanakatte

13.11.2017

The Manteswamy (Nilagaarara) Parampare perhaps has one of the largest cult following in the Karnataka State, covering most of the Old Mysore regions & parts of North Karnataka. The 15th Century Shivasharana Dharmaguru Manteswamy is

the founder of this cult. Legends are built around his life and the shrines at Sri Boppagoudanapura, Chikkalluru and Kappadi are related to personalities depicted in the epic Manteswamy Kavya. Two of his disciples Sharana Lingaiah & Sharana Chennaiah settled in a remote location near Kollegala

town called Kurubanakatte.

Today one can find their Gaddige at Kurubanakatte, which over the years has become an important pilgrim place for the followers of the Manteswamy Parampare. The Kandaya (an ekashula) of Kurubanakatte has gained popularity over the years.

Many people from these regions invite the Kandaya to their village and pay their obeisance to them. We believe that the Kandaya's are removers of obstacles and brings in good fortune to the villages they are taken in procession.

ABOUT THE KSHETRA:

The Kurubanakatte Kshetra is under the Dharmaguru Manteswamy Samsthana Matha, Boppegowdana (BG) Pura. The Dharmadhikari for the Kshetra is from the family of the BG Pura Matha. Late Sri. B.L. Sadananda Urs was the previous Raje Dharmadhikari; he was the paternal uncle of the current Mathadhipathi of the BG Pura Matha, Sri. Gnananda Channa Raje Urs. It is during the time of Sri. B.L. Sadananda Raje Urs that received this Kshetra much development. Recognising the efforts of Late Sri. B.L. Sadananda Raje Urs, his son the current Dharmadhikari Sri. B.S. Varun Linga Raje Urs has constructed a meditation hall (dyana mandira) and has installed a bust of his late father, the architect of today's Kurubanakatte.

THE EVENT:

HH Sri. Yaduveer Krishnadatta Chamaraja Wadiyar, Maharaja of Mysore was invited to inaugurate the said installations at Kurubanakatte. The invitation was extended to me as well. On the auspicious Kade Karthika Somavara (last Monday of the Karthika month) (14.11.2017) Over 14,000 people belonging to the Manteswamy sect headed by Sri. Varun Raje Urs received us. We were taken in a grand procession with all the honours and regalia of the Matha. Prior to reaching Kurubanakatte we received a warm reception in all the villages we came across between Kollegala Town and Kurubanakatte. After performing puje to the main deity, inaugurating the meditation hall and the Bust, curtains were drawn on the function with a stage event.

This event was of historical significance as it was a repeat of a similar event conducted 25 years ago and attended by our previous generation (our respective parents). The inauguration of certain developmental activities was carried out by the then Maharaja of Mysore HH Late Sri. Srikantadatta Narasimharaaja Wadiyar (my revered maternal uncle), Maharani of Mysore HH Smt. Pramoda Devi Wadiyaravaru (current Rajamatha) along with late Rajasevadhurina Sardar M.R. Lakshmikanth Raje Urs (my revered father & Mathadipathi of Sri. Manteswamy Matha, Malavalli), Late Maharajakumari Smt. Meenakshi Deviavaru (daughter of HH Sri. Jayachamaraja Wadiyar & my most revered mother) and Late Sri. B.R. Siddalinga Raje Urs the Mathadhipathi of the Manteswamy Matha, BG Pura. The event was organised by late Sri. B.L. Sadananda Raje Urs.

During the event Sri. Yaduveer called upon the members of the Ursu community to play an important role in the political scenario of the State with the hope that the golden era of Mysore can be relived. He expressed his happiness and gratitude for being part of the well-organised and wellattended event.




WADIYARS AND MANTESWAMY MATHA

Legend says that the two institutions Wadiyars of Mysore and Manteswamy Parampare are connected going back to the 15th Century. It is believed that it was Manteswamy (the Jangama) who instructed Yaduraya (progenitor of Wadiyars of Mysore) to help the family of Chamaraja from the treacherous Maranayaka, and it is he who gave him his Jolage, which became the flag of the Mysore royal family. There is also reference to Rachappaji (disciple of Manteswamy), to have helped

one of the Wadiyar Rulers to defeat one of their enemies. This can be deduced by what is sung by the Nilagaara singers as part of the recital of the Manteswamy Kavya (one of the greatest oral epics of Karnataka).

However going back a century, my paternal great grand Sardar father Sri. Μ. Lakshmikanth Raje married to Maharajakumari Smt. Cheluvajammaniavaru (daughter of HH Sri. Chamaraja Wadiyar X, Maharaja of Mysore) and my father late Rajasevadhurina Sardar M.R. Lakshmikanth Raje Urs married was Maharajakumari Smt. Meenakshi



Advent of The Yadavas Part 2

As we have to accord the honor of having founded the Yadava Dynasty in Mysore to Yaduraya, so to Raja Wodeyar has to be accorded the honour of enlarging What was a modest Chieftainship into the rank of a Kingdom, and of securing for its Ruler a proud and historic throne.

> Beginning his reign in the year 1578, Raja Wodeyar had a long career of forty years of unbroken successes till his death in the "year 1617.. He seems to have been gifted both with military talent and political acumen, and rose thereby from the headship of 33 villages and the command of 300 soldiers to the position of one who was able to face the massed array of nearly a lakh of foot, seven to twelve thousand hundred horses, and one elephants.

Despite the presence of a Viceroy of the Vijayanagar Kingdom at Srirangapatnam, he went on subduing one neighboring Chieftain after another, till in 1610 he ousted the Vijayanagar Viceroy himself. from Srirangapatnam, transferred his capital to it and ascended the throne

there.

That was on the 21st of March 1610. From then the Capital of the Dynasty was shifted from Mysore to Srirangapatnam.



As the Kingdom extended, the military force increased owing to constant warfare and the collection of revenue and protection of life and property of the increasing population required increased attention, and Raja Wodayar found it necessary. to appoint a Dalvoy or military head, who was also Sarvadhikari or Chief Administrator. Bettada Arasu, a nephew of his, was appointed to the combined offices. Every village in the State was provided with officials for supervision, protection and collection of revenue.

Fine warrior and remarkable administrator that he was, he was also a man of piety, devotion, and literary culture.' He improved the temples at Srirangapatnam Mysore and Melkote, and made gifts of land for their maintenance.

He also inaugurated in 1610 the celebration of the Navarathri festival on a religious basis and on a spectacular scale, which greatly helped to add to the lustre and increase the glamour of royalty.

Tumkur Visit

YKC Wadiyar visited the city on Monday and recalled the 'unique bond' between the erstwhile Mysore rulers and the people here.

At a function organised by Akhila Bharata Ladara Sangha in his honour in which was felicitated, Yaduveer said, "The people here have not forgotten the contributions made by the erstwhile Mysore rulers. I express my gratitude for reminding about the relationship between the people and the kings."

He said the people have not forgotten the fact that Chamaraj Wadiyar X had provided land for the construction of Ambabhavani temple at Sira. "Chamaraj Wadiyar X ruled for 33 years and his contribution to the state was unique," he recalled.

Yaduveer said he prayed to Goddess Ambabhavani to bless the district with more rain, crops and prosperity.

Deputy Commissioner K P Mohan Raj, who was the chief guest, said the Mysore kings developed the state well as they considered their subjects as their own children. Hence, the people are proud about the Mysore Royals, he added.





Swami Veereshananda Saraswathi of Ramakrishna Vivekananda Ashram, who graced the occasion, said, "The Myore kings lived up to the saying 'Raja Prathyaksha Devatha' - a king is the real God. They built lakes and tanks for the people. Today, it is painful to see that such water bodies are not being protected.

They also developed temples and encouraged seers. The Mysore Maharajas were ready to help Swami Vivekananda to take part in the World Parliament of Religions in the USA as the representative of Hindu religion. This has been recorded in Ramakrishna Mission's documents," he recalled. The seer called upon Yaduveer to tour the state at least 100 days a year to create as it reminds the people of the good works.






Purnahuti of the Ati Rudra Yaga

YKC Wadiyar offering Purnahuti of the Ati Rudra Maha Yaga

Rudra is a synonym of Lord Shiva and also stands for Jeevatma and Paramatma. Agni (fire) is a representative form a Rudra. Rudra Yaga will conducted by chanting 169 mantras as per the rituals prescribed in Yajurveda Samhita. In these mantras, Lord Shiva is extolled as the forces of nature, such as Earth, Energy and Wind with their derivatives, referred as the aspects of Rudra. Shata Rudreeya Mantra Parayana / Homa with Vasordhaara and pacifies the ferocious forms of Rudra and pleasing the peaceful aspects of Lord Shiva, resulting in prosperity and well-being.

The method of Ati RudraYaga require 121 ritwiks (pundits) reciting 11 times Rudra mantras, performing rituals in 11

Homa Kundas daily for 11 days. The other worships like Ekadasa Rudrabhisheka, Veda parayana, Bilwarchana, Ashtavadhana Seva, Shata Chandi Parayana, Nama Sankeertana, Armadana are part of Ati Rudra Yaga, every day.

The Mythic Society:


A pioneering institution of Indic studies in South India, the Mythic Society was founded in 1909 by some European enthusiasts in Bangalore. F.H.Richards, who was the Collector of the Bangalore

Cantonment District took the initiative and a meeting was held in his residence on 5th May, 1909 and 17 members joined this new academic

'club' with Dr. Traverse, the first
Director of the Indian Institute
of Science, being its first
President too.



Father Tabard, the parish priest of St. Patrick church was its next President for long and he gave the slogan that 'Mysorean must know Mysore better'.



The Daly Memorial Hall foundation stone was laid by The Maharaja, H.H. Krishnaraja Wadiyar IV on August 30, 1916, and inaugurated by The Yuvraja, H.H. Kanteeerva Narasimharaja Wadiyar on July 25, 191, who also served as the Patron of The Mythic Society.

Daly Memorial Hall has seen Mahatma Gandhi and Nobel laureates like Rabindranath Tagore and C V Raman deliver lectures. Researchers such as Dr B.L Rice, Sir John Marshall, Fred Goodwill, Dr A Venkatasubbaiah & Dr M.V Krishna Rao were associated with the Mythic Society. The Mysore ruler named the hall after Sir Hugh Daly, Resident of Mysuru, and the society's first honorary president. Daly's association with Mysuru went beyond administration.
